Baseball cards of the 51 players claim a place of importance in the Peter J. McGovern Little League Museum in Williamsport, Pa.

Cards of the players who participated in two one-inning games as part of four All-Star teams invited to play on the South Lawn of the White House on July 16, 2008, join the cards featuring President George W. Bush and baseball great Nolan Ryan as Little Leaguers.

The framed collection includes a baseball card of President Bush in his Midland Central Little League uniform, and of Mr. Ryan who played on the Alvin Little League.
